Looking ahead, Jenkins is working with Schutz to create, manufacture and distribute handbags with a rainbow teardrops design inspired by Nelson Mandela and his gift of uniting people. Their thought is to have Zanele train the other weavers in a new skill: to make the hand block-print and the rainbow bags. Jenkins plans to do the distributing, establishing the sales channel partnerships – including partnering with the Unstoppable Foundation, a California-based nonprofit that does work in developing nations – to support educational products. But above all else, whatever Jenkins does each day, she does it with compassion and love.
